Many classes attracted standing-room-only crowds, but none more so than the five-part Stewards Training School program, led by Director of Education Jamie Lumm. Individual classes on stewards’ rights, investigation and research, Informal and Formal Step A led to Friday morning’s mock arbitration. By the end, attendees had a full sample case file to help in handling grievances when they returned to their stations.

The workshops weren’t all presented in a cut-and-dried manner. Several used humorous skits, such as “Forrest Gump Gets Excessed” and a Star Wars-themed Contract Administration Unit bit on how carriers are treated on the workroom floor, to get across the information.
